An industrial tribunal in April ruled that she should be re-engaged, but the company only made their decision after a vote of the workforce showed they were overwhelmingly in favour of her return.

Miss Hollingworth, aged 32, said: "I was overjoyed when I won the tribunal, but of course that was not going to be the end of it.

"I knew the company were going to refuse to reinstate me, which they did for a long while.

"When I found out I was going to get my job back I was thrilled. I was very touched by the support people have shown for me.

"Most people want me to go back. That is why I am looking forward to it."

Hollingworth added: "I am sure it will set some form of precedent. I hope other people in the same position would not have to go to a tribunal to protect their jobs."

Hollingworth Miss returns to work on Monday, June 14, in a similar engineering post to the one she left when she was

sacked.
